For those of you who have not visited the Bird Dog Museum complex, it is a wonderful place to spend a day exploring. Exhibits range from display cases of trophies, to sections devoted to various breeds and diversified activities, to a library and the walls are covered with Patron Plaques, Hall of Fame dogs and people, many of whom are well known to the Brittany world. The Museum/Hall of Fame wing is connected to the Education/Library wing by a pleasant sunlit atrium. In the Education wing there is also a most fascinating room devoted to a taxidermist's artistry in preserving wildlife. Shelves on three sides of this room and filled with various game birds, both upland game and waterfowl, fox, mink and other types of small game. The fourth wall is the "eye-catcher" in this room, with a diorama covering the entire wall. A hunting scene, it includes a wild turkey, dove, quail, pheasant, a raccoon, squirrel and other small wild life species.
