

2025 Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame Ceremonies

The week of celebration always begins on the preceding Tuesday with workers in our beautiful museum and hall of fame. During the week, Mary Crawford, Ken Blackman and Ken Windom rehung all of the dog portraits leaving more open wall space for future portraits. Ken W. brought the beautiful stained wood backboard with aluminum letters attached, reading "Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame", and with Rick Smith's help, hung it high up on the wall as you enter our hall. Steve Ralph our webmaster came early and photographed our museum for the website. We finished our projects for the week at day's end on Thursday. We are very proud of our Brittany museum and hall of fame!

Our annual Friday evening celebration began at the Hampton Inn Hotel in Collierville, TN after the arrival of Brittany folks. What a crowd! We welcomed approximately 50 people for our usual cocktail and auction party in the hotel lobby. Rick Smith and Mary Crawford hosted the meal and drinks and Dave Lincoln furnished the beer. Judy Graves brought the famous grape salad since Mary Jo and Ray Trimble couldn't attend this year and Nancy Clendenen assisted with meal preparation. We thank Ken Windom, Henry Wierzbicki, Harlene Johnson and others who helped with the party both Friday and Saturday evenings.

The annual auction was again successful due to Scott Johnson's expert auctioneering with Rick handing up the items. We had quite an array of donations that brought in over \$4500 for our endowment fund. Harlene Johnson and Christin Smith Lynch kept track of the dollars since Mary Karbiner couldn't attend this year. Christin, Rick's daughter, now lives in Oklahoma and also served as grandfather Delmar's driver; we hope she comes again next year. The exuberant crowd had a great time visiting with old friends we hadn't seen in many years.

The Hall of Fame ceremonies took place on Saturday at the Bird Dog Museum in Grand Junction, TN, a short drive from Collierville. Since we were scheduled after lunch, it gave visitors a chance to tour our museum in the morning. A wonderful lunch buffet was served to everyone after the morning session. This year the induction ceremonies had a huge attendance of over 350 people and the Brittanys had the largest number of people of any breed . . . again! Chairman Rick Smith presided over the presentations.

Inductee 2X Champion, 3X RU Champion FC Ortho Acres Booker T, owned by David Webb and Tommy Tracy, was our new hall of fame dog. Booker was bred by Marilynne and Clem Little. He accomplished national recognition during his lifespan, which was just a couple of months over ten years of age.

Booker had 6 Derby wins in 2001, winning the ABC Eastern Futurity. He had 31 placements with several major AKC wins and was retired with 8 hour wins with 19 American Field placements. Booker's performance record was exclusively due to Tom's training and handling in field trials, the fact being that he was "so easy to train".

Without a doubt Booker's biggest accomplishment was his contribution to the Brittany breed and the offspring he sired. Booker's strong characteristics have been passed genetically along to most all of his pups, down through three generations. It's a calm and quiet temperament along with athleticism and trainability. His record of production increases daily as the accomplishments of his progeny continue with hour winners still coming 3 generations later.

Booker's winning progeny are many. Several won the Purina All-Age Dog of the Year Award, the Quail, Chicken, Pheasant, and Gun Dog Classics, along with other one hour championships and the Nationals. His progeny total 101 hour wins, grand progeny total 44 hour wins and great grand progeny total 8 hour wins. He is indeed worthy to be in our hall of fame.
