Dedication of the Life-size Brittany Bronze set for Noon, February 11, 2017 at the Bird Dog Museum, Grand Junction, TN.





SAMproject UPDATE July 7, 2016

The Brittany finally has a Life-size Bronze to represent the breed at the BIRD DOG MUSEUM and FIELD TRIAL HALL OF FAME in Grand Junction, Tennessee.

The combined efforts of Rick and Delmar Smith, Dick Pulliam, Bill Norvell, Ken Jacobson, Tonya Brotherton and Gary Lockee placed a life-size Brittany Bronze on a 5,500 lb. block of granite from South Dakota, on a two foot reinforced concrete base in the Hall of Fame gardens on June 21, 2016.

Ken read a short poem "Sam is waiting" as Rick and Delmar placed Sam's ashes in an urn under the monument. Ken drove 2,500 miles from San Juan Island, Washington to deliver the life-size Brittany Bronze.

He also delivered the "Records Live..." the original bronze featuring Pacolet Cheyenne Sam with Jacolet's Wandering Star and Tigar's Jocko backing. "Records Live..." is now on display on an antique myrtle wood table from southern Oregon in the entrance of the Bird Dog Museum and Hall of Fame. The SAM portion of the bronze was used as the "SAM Bronze" model to raise the funds to create and install the life-size Brittany Bronze and help fund the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame Endowment Fund.

Ken also brought National Amateur Champion/Dual Ch. Tigar's Jocko's trophy for display in the Brittany Wing. Johnny Munson and Jocko won the 1964 Amateur Pheasant Shooting Dog Championship, the first major win by a Brittany in an American Field Championship.

Rick flew in from West Virginia; Delmar drove from Oklahoma and Bill Norvell drove from Texas to operate the 6 Ton Forklift and place the granite block. Locals Dick Pulliam, Tonya Brotherton and Gary Lockee were essential for the coordination and solving of miscellaneous problems.

Major financial contributions by Jim Leverich, Paul & Lisa Pollock, Rick Smith & Kaye Davis, Delmar Smith, Ken Jacobson and Dave Carlson were essential to the SAM projects' success. The sculpture for "Records Live..."; "The SAM BRONZE"; and the "BRITTANY MONUMENT" was Matthew Gray Palmer of San Juan Island, Washington.
